BOARD MEETING:

An explanation of total foundation and pathway cash balances are: Pathway projects \$61,617.66; donations \$12,290.91; Other \$1,903.06 with a total cash balance \$75,811.63. See Lion Clair Winebar for more information.

Board meeting will be moved to the Town Hall 3rd floor conference room starting in October. A fund raising drive will be starting in 2 weeks, led by Lion Dick Ramseyer with each member of the Pathway Board contacting individuals for key donations. Goal for this fund-drive is \$117,000. Bluffton Mayor, Richard Johnson, was present to congratulate the Lions Club for starting the pathway projects. And to announce that Bluffton has received a grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation of \$850,000 to develop a pathway on route 103 from the County Line Road to Arbys. This will begin in 2023.

SEPTEMBER 3RD MEETING:



Lori Nester, Director of the WIC program, attended the September 3rd meeting of the Blufton Lions to explain the services that WIC provides and who is eligible for these services. This program is primarily for women, infants and children and a part of Ohio's public health system. This is intended to reach income-eligible pregnant, breastfeeding and non-breastfeeding postpartum women, infants and children up to 5 years of age with a medical or nutrition risk. Their goal is prevention of nutrition-related health problems. This program provides supplemental foods to lowincome individuals. Surrounding agencies refer eligible patients to WIC or an individual can apply.

SEPTEMBER 17TH MEETING:



Lion Ed Yeager, president of the Bluffton Community Assistance Program was the speaker for the Sept 17th club meeting. Collections of food go to the St. John's UCC and distribution is the 3rd Saturday of each month. There are 45 to 50 families now receiving these donations in the community. From monetary donations Lion Yeager purchases ground meat, eggs and bacon to be given to the families monthly, along with canned goods and non-perishable items.

Last Christmas 66 families were adopted. The budget is \$25,600. \$17,500 goes to food; \$1,000 to school supplies; \$1,000 disaster relief; \$4,000 for rent/utilities assistance; \$700 medical needs as glasses/prescriptions; \$500 stranded motorist voucher for gas; \$900 operating including insurance. BAMA and the police department both assist with referrals to this program. Organizations assisting are: Boy Scouts; Schools; Post Office; College; Annual Chili Cook-off; Stratton's Auto; Promo Hits and others.

Lion President Patty Navin submitted a proposal for the Lion's club to collect each day an item to provide a box and donate to the Bluffton Food Pantry. A list of possible items will be mailed to all lions. At our Christmas party which will be held December 3rd starting at 6:30 PM we will package these items for the food bank and enjoy the remainder of the evening with a meal and fellowship. This will be held at St. John's UCC. If you would care to donate a gift card to the Community Market to place in our food boxes, this would be appreciated.
